**Year 11 Commitment sessions**

Starting in September students will have ‘commitment’ sessions on a Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday. These will be important sessions to help students prepare for their exams. **The college day will finish at 3.30pm for Year 11 on these days.**

On a Tuesday all students will have Maths, Science or English Commitment which they must attend.

On a Wednesday and Thursday students are expected to stay on site to work with their teachers in their option subjects. Students who are making good progress and are on track with their work may not be required to remain on site on a Wednesday and Thursday and they will be given permission to leave.
